Notes of a Meeting held on Tuesday 15 <sup>th</sup> June 2010 at 7:30 pm in Coldingham Primary School

Also in attendance were Cllr J Fullarton, PC Richardson, and a good number of members of the public.

1. Apologies were received from those noted above, also, Cllr M Cook, & Cllr D Raw.
2. Previous Minutes were accepted as a true record of the previous meeting
3. Treasurers Report : Account healthy as SB grant has been paid. Verge strimming bill can now be paid. Cheque written in exchange for funds to progress PO applications
4. Police Report : PC Richardson gave a report of calls received in the period. Bins near the beach were set on fire, and there were a few calls about camping, which were fine. There was 1 accident at Edrom nurseries, a dog-bite incident and some calls regarding security callers. These people have NOTHING to do with the police, and we were warned to be careful. If it seems too good to be true...it probably is!! There was some trouble at Co'path at the weekend (their Gala weekend). The new Inspector (Clark) is writing to all CCs in the area. PC Richardson repeated that if anyone sees any trouble, lift the phone and let them know immediately.
5. Matters Arising : Coldingham beach has been awarded Blue Flag status...wonderful for the area vistors and bathing etc. Signage : the sign on the Reston Rd had fallen off but has been fixed, think the sign on the Eyemouth side of the village has been replaced. RG to check. Noticeboards, RG to check with Mr Ferris that he is happy for us to refurbish them as he was made them originally. Car Park, someone has been measuring up to cost resurfacing, it was pointed out it may be better to wait till some of the work on the new PO has been done. It may also have been swept as requested. The boat building project was a great success, raising about £500. It is building a Boat for St Abbs, and the first one should be ready for Herring Queen week.
6. Planning : Post Office – plans have been submitted, being progressed in conjunction with Scottish Rural Devt Project (SRDP), and may be partly assisted by the Post Office diversification project. Land & legal issues are now resolved. Pharmacy – motion gone through SBC, now gone to NHS.  
Applications this month include erection of 2 small windturbines at Westloch, and plans for redevelopment of the Youth Hostel. No objections were made to either of these applications. Temporary use of a portacabin as a surgery was also requested for the period of refurbishment. This was also agreed but request made to wait till after Gala day on 25<sup>th</sup> July if possible.
7. SBC Cllrs Report : SBC are investigating a bylaw to prevent camping on the beach. Duns have been awarded lottery funding and received a grant from SBC to upgrade the pool. Blue bins are all out now, don't seem to be any major issues. Green bins, still awaiting word, although SBC are looking at routes. Fortnightly collections will commence around October. The worker injured at the Eshiels plant has cracked ribs but is improving. Road repairs, SBC now have about £3.5k towards the total £8k required, so obviously the more major defects will

be done, but other minor work may not. Recycling towards zero waste is moving on, our current system is acceptable within the specification set out. A new site (like the one visited in Bournemouth) near Gala is now at the tender stage. It was asked if JF could enquire about marking the dips in the road between Coldingham & Eyemouth as they constitute a hazard

9. AOCB : DJ had a meeting with Awards for All as part of the close-out of the project to show the Christmas Lights and also the Hall sets. Coldingham Gala will be on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> July from noon till 5pm on the playing field. Publicity will be coming out soon. Part of the entertainment will be a talent contest, free face painting and a fancy dress contest. If children (under 12) come in fancy dress they get in free! The seat opposite Lawfield appears to have been removed, JF to find out if this has been for refurbishment. He was also asked to see if boards could be supplied in bus shelters as something to sit on. There will be a Christmas Fayre in the Village Hall on 13/14 Nov.
